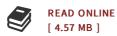

Engine Speed. The engine speed should be at a setting that allows best response when and if a rapid power increase is needed. The stabilized approach parameters should be confirmed at 500 feet (VMC) or 1, 000 feet IMC above airport TDZE. This is approximately 1-2 minutes from touchdown. If the approach is not stabilized at that altitude, a go-around should be considered, if the approach is not stable and on all targets at 50 feet above airport elevation, a go-around should be immediately initiated. A go-around balked landing should be executed at any time that the approach is determined to be unstable. f. There may be specific, airport unique special cases that make transitioning to a stabilized approach difficult due to the unusual circumstances. Examples of special cases are ATC clearances that request airspeeds in excess of those airspeeds normally flown in the terminal area, an...
