To a certain extent, early nineteenth-century Russian apologists of native medieval culture helped to promote this false notion. Subsequent collectors, scholars, and literary historians, however, have conclusively established that Russian literature during the first two centuries of its existence (eleventh and twelfth) not only assimilated important genres of medieval Byzantine literature, but on the basis of them produced many original works of distinction in those genres which were also typical of medieval Western European literature. As in the medieval West, no doubt a great deal of what was written in Kievan Rus has been lost to us, but that which has survived is considerable in bulk, and much of it testifies to the fact that early Russian literary culture reached a high point of genuine creative growth until it was checked by barbarian incursions from the steppes and...
