It is the tale of a beleaguered British battle group fighting desperately to prevent the Taliban seizing control of Afghanistans Helmand province before the arrival of US Marines. Dead Men Risen examines the nature of true military leadership as three officers at different levels of command perish while leading their men from the front. Underequipped and overstretched, guardsmen from the coal mining valleys and slate quarry villages of Wales found themselves in some of the most intense combat by British troops for more than a generation. They were confronted by a Taliban enemy they seldom saw, facing the constant threat of Improvised Explosive Devices and ambush. The action takes place in 2009 as General Stanley McChrystal, the new commander in Afghanistan, decides that the war is in danger of being lost. One British officer had worked with McChrystal in Iraq in multiple operations that decimated the al-Qaeda network.
