Houbolts First Crusade In his paper presented before the Society of Automotive Engineers, of all organizations, in April 1960, 41-year-old John Cornelius Houbolt focused on the problem of rendezvous in space, involving, for example, the ascent of a satellite or space ferry as to make a soft contact with another satellite or space station already in orbit. His analysis of soft rendezvous could have applied to a lunar mission, but the paper did not specifically refer to that 29 possibility. However, Houbolt already had been studying such an application.
