




Hawaii Its Agricultural Possibilities (Classic Reprint)

In this respect, Hawaii is very favorably situated, being favored with perhaps, as nearly as may be, an ideal climate. The slight daily and seasonal range of temperature is almost as striking in Hawaii as in any part of the tropics, while the maximum temperature is by no means high. A temperature of 90 F. is very high for Hawaii. In Honolulu, for example, the maximum temperature for the past fifteen years is 89 . The average annual temperature ranges in Honolulu from 72.9 to 74 for different years. During the same period, the lowest recorded temperature was 52 F., and such low temperatures ordinarily persist only for a few hours. The daily range of temperature is seldom greater than 11 F. While the temperature records are more complete for Honolulu than for other parts of the Islands, there are, nevertheless, long continued records at certain points on all the Islands; and these records show essentially the...
