

He came of old Holland-Dutch stock, his ancestors having lived in the state for several generations. His father, Gideon F. Conrad, filled for several years, and with much credit, the office of Sheriff of Ulster County. Thrown upon his own resources by his fathers death, the lad of tender years learned the printers trade, being employed in the office of the Kingston Argus when the Civil War broke out. The patriotism and decision which marked his entire life was very strong in the boy of seventeen. He enlisted in the 120th New York Volunteers (General George H. Sharps regiment), and served in it for most of the war. Early remarkable for his fearless gallantry in action, he took part...
