

One difference between the HERS and HERS-ST models is that the HERS-ST model has an override feature that allows a state official to override highway improvement selections made by the model in order to reflect specific, local conditions. According to FHWA officials, the models override feature will enable state officials to apply specific knowledge about highway improvements (such as whether implementing a particular improvement is feasible) that may not be reflected in the models database. For example, an official might specify that the model reconstruct a highway section rather than resurface it because of problems with the underlying structure of the pavement that are not yet apparent from measurements of the pavements roughness. The override feature is unique to the HERS-ST model. Another difference is that the HERS-ST model is capable of providing detailed results about each of the highway sections it analyzes, including information on the particular improvement...
