Edmund Waller, FRS was born on March 3rd, 1606 in Coleshill, Bucking hamshire. Waller was educated at the Royal Grammar School, High Wycombe and thence on to Eton and King s College, Cambridge. His adult life is very colourful and displays a man whose adventures and experiences made poetry an obvious vessel to express the journey. He entered Parliament early, at age 18, and was, at first, an active member of the opposition. (Waller was to sit in Parliament at various times from 1624-1679) In 1631 he married a London heiress, a surreptitious marriage to a wealthy ward of the Court of Aldermen. Waller was brought before the Star Chamber for this offence, and heavily fined. Waller was however, a wealthy man and stayed so throughout his life despite the many fines he became liable for. His wife bore him a son and a daughter at Beaconsfield but died in 1634. After her death he unsuccessfully courted Lady Dorothy Sidney, the Sacharissa of his poems. By 1643 he had now switched sides to the Royalists and was the leader in the plot...
