The Tao recognizes, as did many biblical writers, right thinking can lead to right doing (orthodoxy), but even more so, right practice leads to right thinking (orthopraxis). Like a fish out of water looking back from whence I came, I see Jesus Way in a broader perspective hearing The Tao throughout The New Testament, especially in Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, and the non-canonical...
