

in Massachusetts, moving to the Granite State shortly after graduating from Haverhill High
School in 1908. After residing in Manchester, Raymond, and Nottingham, she came to Lee in
1919 as the bride of Charles Piper, a lifelong local resident and recently returned veteran of
World War I. Lee was then a small rural com munity of 475 people. Annie soon became involved
in the local concerns of her new town and in 1931 was elected to the Lee School Board, where
she served three terms. During these years of the Great Depression, Annie and her two
colleagues on the board were responsible for overseeing the education of some 60 students
grades one through eight - in three one-room schoolhouses located in North, Center, and
South Lee. In 1935 the voters approved a budget for the district of - half of which was earmarked
