

Lies and Epiphanies: Composers and Their Inspiration from Wagner to Berg (Hardback)

Lies and Epiphanies offers case studies of inspiration in five composers -- Richard Wagner, Gustav Mahler, Wilhelm Furtwangler, Richard Strauss, and Alban Berg. Their own tales of their epiphanies played a determining role in the reception history of their works: the finale of Mahler s Second Symphony was supposedly born of a lightning bolt of inspiration at the funeral of Hans von Bulow, while Alban Berg s Violin Concerto was purportedly his direct response to the tragic early death of Alma Mahler s daughter. Chris Walton looks behind these tales to explore instead the composer s dual role as author and self-commentator, laying bare the fissures and inconsistencies within these artists testimonies and revealing how the putatively extrarational world of creative inspiration intersects with the highly rational world of money and politics. As Walton points out, the composer often imposes on the audience an interpretation of a work and its genesis that is as superficial as the score itself is not. This study seeks to show why.
