We need to know both things. Educational examinations tell us how much a child has accomplished; intelligence examinations tell us how much a child can accomplish. The difference between the two is the child s unused margin of ability. It is not difficult to measure this margin of unused ability, but it can no more be measured without an intelligence examination, than it can without educational examinations. Hence the importance of obtaining both measures. It would be shameful to allow another generation of children to pass through school unmeasured; with so many children and so few psychologists, teachers will have to accomplish this measurement. Public school teachers are as able to use individual examinations like the Herring-Binet, as they are to teach reading,...



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
