He was the seventh child of the family, and was born at Long Calderwood, on the 23rd of May, 1718. He was educated at the parish school, and evidently was a precocious boy. In November, 1731, at the age of thirteen and a half years he entered the University of Glasgow. He studied there for five years. He held a bursary of the Bajan Class of the value of ten pounds a year, for four years. The term Bajan was employed in the French and Scotch Universities, and is evidently a corruption of bee jaune (yellow beak), an expression meant to designate a nestling or unfledged bird. The epithet (Bejants) is still applied to freshmen in St. Andrews. It had been his intention to enter...
