


Some Questions About Language: A Theory of Human Discourse and Its Objects (Paperback)

In this work, Dr Adler argues that these fundamental questions are not satisfactorily handled in the two main philosophies of language that have dominated 20thcentury thinking on the subject - the syntactical and ordinary language approaches. Drawing on the tradition of Aristotle, Aquinas, Poinsot and Husserl, Adler s own discussion exemplifies the third approach, which he describes as semantic and lexical . He advances his theory of meaning and applies it to outstanding philosophical problems.
