There are 11, 866 persons paying a tax in this city; of this number 5461 pay a property tax, four-fifths of which pay a tax on real estate. If the cost of sewerage is to be paid by this class, an expense of over 1, 000, 000 will have to be met by about onesixth of the entire population of the city; and if it is the health of this population, or 30, 000 people, which has demanded the introduction of this improvement, then all those...
