

undertaking which the government of Massachusetts did not then realize. June 24, 1779, Gen.
Charles Cushing, of Pownalborough, sent a letter to the Massachusetts General Court advising
an immediate expedition to dislodge the British before they had time to entrench themselves.
They had already given consideration to the subject, and June 25 gave the Board of War
directions to engage all state or national armed vessels that could be prepared to sail in six
days. They were also directed to charter or impress all private armed vessels available, with a
promise to the owners of a fair compensation for all losses and damages they might sustain,
and the wages of the men were to be the same as paid in the Continental service. The Board
was also to procure the necessary outfit and supplies, and the following were said to have...
