Some characteristic symptoms of PTSD that emerge are re-expe-riencing of the events through dreams or nightmares or flashbacks, irritability or anger, insomnia, an exaggerated startle response, hyper vigilence, and a general numbing of emotional responsive-ness. In one person these symptoms may appear immediately after the event but go away fairly quickly but in another person they may emerge as much as 3 to 6 months after the event and become chronic, and there are wide variations between those two examples. Mental health support for employees going to Iraq began in No-vember 2003 with the addition of a mental health training to a pre-Iraq orientation course.
